Welcome to 2017! We're delighted to embark on a healthy year of hiking, fishing, boating and just plain relaxing in our East Bay Regional Parks.

2016 was a busy year for us. We started major renovations at McLaughlin Eastshore State Park, including restorations of the Brickyard Cove and Albany Beach areas. Also at Eastshore, we accepted a 4.88-acre donation from Golden Gate Fields to extend the Bay Trail west of the racetrack. In Contra Costa County, we purchased a picturesque 76-acre parcel near Mt. Diablo that will become part of the Future Deer Valley Regional Park. In Fremont, we moved ahead with plans to build a parking lot at Mission Peak to relieve some of the parking congestion, and in Pleasanton we broke ground on a 1.2-megawatt solar project that will offset electricity use for the entire Park District.

We invite you to spend time in the Regional Parks in 2017 – join in our annual Trails Challenge, explore a new trail, try a new activity, discover a new park. Thank you for your continued support and for your memberships with the Regional Parks Foundation. Together, we are able to accomplish great things and provide access for all to our beautiful parklands.
