Sand Replacement Underway for Beach Restoration in Alameda

WHEN

Tuesday, October 1, 10 a.m. Rain or shine.

WHFRF

Shoreline Drive between Willow and Grand, Alameda, CA

WHAT

- Bulldozers pushing sand into berms
- 14-inch pipe pumping sand and water onto the beach from offshore barge
- Beach is less than 24 inches wide at high tide in some places
- Major project to replace 82,600 cubic yards of sand washed away over 20+ years
- Fantastic views of San Francisco skyline!
- Light refreshments will be served.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

At a cost of nearly \$5.7 million, the East Bay Regional Park District will restore the beach and dune system to its 1987 footprint, and will protect the shoreline of this popular recreational beach.

Between September and November 2013, 82,600 cubic yards of sand will be pumped from offshore barges onto Crown Memorial State Beach and Alameda Beach.
