# Youth Development Program

# Brief Program Description:

The program aims to build community connections with the new Thurgood Marshall Regional Park - Home of the Port Chicago 50 and the rest of the East Bay Regional Park District (EBRPD), while serving youths from neighborhoods and schools close to the park. Every summer, ten participants are invited to learn about their regional parks, explore personal connections to social justice, and develop educational content that highlights the park's relevance. The program supports youth participants by working directly with EBRPD Naturalists to design and develop digital interpretive media related to the themes of the new park, including natural history, stewardship, and social justice. Additionally, participants spend time with park staff to learn about the many professions required to run a park system, and build skills applicable to employment at EBRPD. Funding for this program, including stipends and lunch, is provided by the Regional Parks Foundation.

# Program & Partnership:

People Who Care Association (PWC) is local community nonprofit organization that serves a racially and socio-economically diverse group of middle and high school-aged students from Pittsburg, California and surrounding areas. Through a combination of mentorships, counseling, learning experiences, and authentic opportunities to give back to their community, PWC provides youths with the education and training needed to realize positive change in their lives and engage with their communities. In 2022, EBRPD and PWC first partnered through a series of day-long programs to augment existing offerings and connect youth to regional parks.

In the summer of 2023, EBRPD and PWC teams deepened their partnership to develop and launch a paid, multi-day program, the first Youth Development Program out of Thurgood Marshall Regional Park - Home of the Port Chicago 50. Thanks to the program's success, EBRPD and PWC will continue to provide this program every summer.
