Black Birders Week - 2023

We birded among the bunkers (technically, magazines) and along the railroad tracks of this former weapons depot, while learning about the site's significance in the desegregation of the U.S. military. Together, we reflected on the work that still needs to be done to make everyone feel welcome in their public lands.
